

## MTM Program Compliance with CMS 2010 Call Letter Requirements

The Outcomes® Medication Therapy Management (MTM) program meets each of the requirements included in the CMS 2010 Call Letter.

Enroll targeted beneficiaries using an opt-out method of enrollment only.	Outcomes has ten years of experience administering opt-out MTM programs.

When targeting patients, Part D sponsors cannot require more than three as the minimum number of chronic diseases or more than eight medications as the minimum number of Part D drugs. Offer a minimum level of MTM services including interventions for both beneficiaries and prescribers...	The Outcomes MTM Program includes both patient- and prescriber-level interventions.
...an annual comprehensive medication review for the beneficiary, which includes a review of medications, interactive, person-to-person consultation, and an individualized, written summary of interactive consultation...	An annual Comprehensive Medication Review (CMR) is a standard covered service. CMRs are interactive and delivered face-to-face by local pharmacists. Our MTM web-platform offers an MTM Profile printout to be shared with the patient.
...and quarterly targeted medication reviews.	Outcomes' Targeted Intervention Program (TIP®) offers targeted reviews on a quarterly or more frequent basis. Interventions are driven by national guidelines and quality metrics defined by HEDIS, NCQA, PQA and other evidence-based initiatives. New TIP protocols are introduced continually and may be customized to meet client-specific needs.
Measure and report details on the number of comprehensive medication reviews, number of targeted medication reviews, number of prescriber interventions, and the change in therapy directly resulting from the interventions.	Outcomes provides clients and providers with detailed real-time reports on MTM activities, including all CMS required data points and more.
For targeted beneficiaries enrolled in the MTM program that are in a LTC setting, sponsors are not required to offer the interactive CMR component, but still must perform quarterly medication reviews and offer interventions targeted to the beneficiaries' prescribers.	Outcomes has experience in administering LTC MTM programs in the same manner described in the Call Letter. These interventions may be identified by providers or through TIPs.
